Gospel Meditation


Matthew 11:25-30

There are times when many of us feel overburdened in our daily life. There can be so many demands, so much to do.

For seafarers, life at sea can be extremely challenging. They are often far from their families and loved ones for long periods of time, working long hours, and facing the threats of accidents, piracy, and harsh weather conditions. And when they come into port in a foreign land, they know no one.

Amid these challenges, Stella Maris provides a beacon of hope and support to seafarers. Its chaplains and volunteers offer the hand of friendship and listen to the concerns of the seafarers they meet. They help seafarers to contact their families back home, take them to Mass, or arrange for a priest to come on board, provide transport to local shops, and help to resolve problems of missing pay or substandard conditions.

Just as Jesus offers rest to those who are burdened and weary, Stella Maris offers refuge and support to seafarers who are facing the challenges of life at sea. Its chaplains and volunteers are the hands and feet of Jesus in this world, bringing comfort to seafarers.

> Appeal Talk

Sea Sunday 2023



Good morning/evening everyone

My name is [xxx] and I am here to speak about Stella Maris, formerly known as Apostleship of the Sea, the official maritime charity of the Catholic Church.

In today's Gospel we heard Jesus say 'Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest.' Stella Maris has over 1,000 chaplains and volunteers in ports all over the world, who help seafarers and fishers when they are overburdened and in need of rest.

I'd like to share with you one recent story of how Stella Maris' work, supported by your prayers and generosity, can make a huge difference.

A ship arrived at Teesport in North East England last year with 22 seafarers on board. Two Stella Maris ship visitors conducted a routine visit, taking with them welcome packs and bags of clothing.

It transpired that the crew was under huge mental and physical strain. One confided that, during the voyage to Teesport from the USA, he had only been getting two hours sleep a night because he was so stressed and overworked. He was also concerned that the crew were no longer able to operate the vessel safely as they were all exhausted.

The Stella Maris team contacted the relevant authorities and a vessel detention notice was served that afternoon.

As a result, the seafarers were able to go ashore for the first time in many months and spent time relaxing at the seafarers' centre in the port. 11 of the crew were repatriated to the Philippines later that month.

Stella Maris' ship visiting can only happen because of your support - your generosity helps its chaplains and volunteers to support over 137,000 seafarers in ports around the UK and to reach 70,000 ships around the world.

Parish Checklist

Before Sea Sunday

- Confirm with the Parish Priest that there will be a second collection at the end of all Masses on Sea Sunday weekend.
- Ask one of the readers or another volunteer to read the appeal talk on Sea Sunday, if this is possible. Otherwise perhaps the Priest may be able to read the appeal or play the audio appeal.
- Please display the posters on your notice board as soon as possible
- Put the announcement in the parish newsletter, one the week before, one for Sea Sunday.
- If possible, include the intercessions for seafarers and the work of Stella Maris in the service.
- Pass on our children's activity sheet to the children's catechists.

On Sea Sunday

- Make Gift Aid envelopes available around pews before people arrive for Mass, or have them available as people leave. (Prayer cards are available on request).
- Check the reader, volunteer or Parish Priest has the appeal text to read at the end of Mass, before the second collection

After Sea Sunday

- Please send the collection by cheque, payable to 'Stella Maris', to Stella Maris, 39 Eccleston Square, London, SW1V 1BX, together with the Gift Aid envelopes, so the tax can be reclaimed.
- Please display the thank you poster (on the reverse) and fill in the amount your parish raised.
- Put the thank you announcement in your newsletter and e-newsletter the week after Sea Sunday.

Please take up the second collection in support of Stella Maris (Apostleship of the Sea) on Sea Sunday, 9th July 2023 (or whichever date is best for your parish).

We have Gift Aid envelopes available (some are included) for your parishioners' use. Please contact us if you would like more Gift Aid envelopes. If your parish has their own contactless device (e.g. Dona, SumUp) you might be able to use this for your second collection for Stella Maris.

Once Mass has finished, please collect any completed Gift Aid envelopes and count the total money donated.

Note: Please could you kindly check the donation within each Gift Aid envelope completed. If the amount enclosed is the same as stated on the envelope, please do not change it. However if the amount enclosed differs from the amount stated on the envelope, please write clearly on the envelope the amount that was enclosed.
